Medicare Physician Definition - Action Alert

In December 2015, Representatives Jan Schakowsky (D-IL) and Kristi Noem (R-SD) introduced H.R. 4277 (Medicare Mental Health Access Act) in the U.S. House of Representatives. This important bipartisan legislation expands the Medicare definition of a physician to include psychologists. The NAN BOD sent letters of support to the co-sponsors of the bill and will sign on as a supporter on the APA Practice Organization fact sheet. NAN also sent out a recent Action Alert that includes further information about this important issue. Audio Recording IME Evaluations in British Columbia – Success Story!

The Inter Organizational Practice Committee (IOPC), representing NAN and other professional organizations, advocated against a proposal to allow audio recording during IME evaluations in British Columbia. The IOPC sent a letter to the Rules Revisions Committee of the Supreme Court of British Columbia, which outlined numerous concerns regarding ways an audiotape could compromise the validity of the evaluation itself, and the security of neuropsychological measures. Based on opposition by members of the legal and health care communities, this proposal was ultimately denied.
